



During the beginning of the semester we design work with this firing method in mind. Weekly demos will refine your skills and individual instruction. Mid semester, we will explore flashing slips and 7 new glazes, including new crystalline matte and ash glazes. As a class we will then prep for the firing and strategically load the kiln. At the end of the semester, we will fire the kiln collectively and participate in adding wood, baking soda and salt through the kilning. The class will also have access to the gas reduction kiln.


